

- Work with people while they are continuing to use drugs, with love & respect






Massive Increase in Opiate Overdose Deaths


Drug-related deaths have risen in 2020 in states across the country.

Increase in drug-related deaths from 2019 through the first portion of 2020.





Chronic Hepatitis C – Age Distribution of Newly Reported Cases, California 2007 and 2017





Co-Infection with HCV in Scott County

- 92% of people infected with HIV were co-infected with HCV
- HCV increases in 20-29 year-olds preceded HIV outbreak in Scott County
