She received her Master's Degree in International Public Health from Columbia University, and received her PhD in Epidemiology from the Fielding School of Public Health at UCLA. Dvora is based in Cape Town and is an Honorary Senior Lecturer in Epidemiology for the University of Cape Town, South Africa. Since receiving her doctorate degree, she has been leading a formative study of sexual behaviors, substance use and sexually transmitted infection in pregnant and breastfeeding women in Cape Town to inform a pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) study.
